

#### CLASSES SCHEDULED TO BE OFFERED

Class # 1 – EMT Continuing Education- Friday, Saturday, and Sunday

P-0000 (24hrs)

This class will provide an EMT with the required hours for recertification. <u>This class will start on Friday</u> <u>afternoon at 1:00pm.</u> (Friday class will be 8 hours of electives, Saturday and Sunday will be 16 hours of the Kentucky Core Content requirements for recertification).

Instructors: Air Evac Life Team

#### Class # 2 - Basic Firefighting - Friday, Saturday, and Sunday

This class is for the new firefighters or seasoned veterans wanting to "brush up" on their skills. Students will be given some basic fire fighting knowledge and practicing skills necessary to begin a long and safe life of fire suppression. NOTE: This class has an optional session from 1:00 PM Friday until 6:00 PM Students attending ALL sessions will complete the 20 training hours recommended by the Kentucky Fire Commission before emergency response activity. Protective clothing will be required all three days and shall consist of NFPA APPROVED coat, pants, boots, hood, helmet, gloves, SCBA and spare bottle.

#### Class # 3 - Hard To Get Hours - Saturday and Sunday

#### Each segment 3hrs

Have you found yourself needing a few training hours that are next to impossible to find? This newly structured course will suit your needs by gaining you 12 of the hard to get fire service training hours in the state. Students will be able to choose one of two classes offered in the morning and afternoon each day. Three hour classes will be offered and students are required to attend the entire class.

#### Class # 4 –Agricultural Heavy Rescue - Saturday and Sunday

#### Q-0006 (14-16 hrs)

This class combines farm rescue, vehicle rescue and heavy rescue principles. It is designed to present challenging scenarios that build on previous training and skills. This is not a class to learn basic skills. Equipment Needed: Safety glasses or goggles, Structural or rescue protective clothing with hand and foot protection. Prerequisites: Previous training in basic vehicle rescue including practical skills. This is a physically challenging course.

#### Class # 5 – Firefighter Survival – Saturday Only

#### FC-10000 (6-8hrs)

This course will emphasize the removal of trapped or unconscious firefighters from a burning building and selfrescue techniques when the primary escape route is blocked. This is a required course for initial firefighter certification in Kentucky. Full turnout gear is required. SCBA unit will be provided.

#### Class # 6 – Firefighter Rescue – Sunday Only

#### FC-20000 (6-8hrs)

This course is designed to teach you how to rescue fellow firefighters from a burning structure. Special techniques are used for the rescue portion of the 2-part series. This is a required course for initial firefighter certification in Kentucky. The completion of Firefighter Survival is a prerequisite for this Full turnout gear is required. SCBA unit will be provided. Course.

#### Class #7 – Hazmat Operations – Saturday and Sunday

#### T-0002 (14-16hrs)

This training program addresses Operations Level response for Hazardous Material from IFSTA. This class will take the student from hazardous incident recognition through setting up a decontamination line. If you have bunker gear, you will need it for Sunday.

**Prerequisite**: Hazmat Awareness (from Friday night class or other approved class.)

#### Class # 8 - Hazmat Awareness - Friday night

This 4-hour training program addresses Awareness Level response for Hazardous Material from IFSTA. This class will teach the student to use various hazardous material handbooks to Identify a hazardous incident.

#### Class # 9 - Flashover Awareness - Friday Night

#### FC-40000 (3hrs)

This 3-hour class is designed to deliver the minimum requirement for the 150-hour certification. During this class, the student will learn the indicators, both internal and external, of an impending flashover or backdraft situation and tactics to reduce the risks. This class will be lecture only. No live burn will be held and NO PPE will be required. Classroom Lecture Only.

#### Class # 10 – School Bus Extrication - Friday Night

Q-0000 (4hrs)

This course will take a look at school bus construction, creating openings and utilizing openings in the construction, typical and hybrid power as well as address state and national data related to incidents.

#### Class # 11 \_Swift Water Awareness- Friday Night

Q-0005 (3hrs)

This class teaches all the knowledge and skills required to perform at the awareness level which is designed for overview of specific rescue situations and precautions that Responders should utilize on scene of a swift water incident. This class is a prerequisite for taking Swift Water Rescue Operations. NO hands On- No PPE needed.

#### Class #12 -American Heart Association: BLS Provider Course- Friday night

P-0001 (4hrs)

In this course, students will learn how to recognize a life-threatening emergency, how to provide basic life support and what to do in case of an airway obstruction or choking.

#### Class #13 – Autism Awareness- Friday night

This training provides first responders, firefighters, and EMTs with information and guidelines for communicating with individuals on the Autism Spectrum during emergency situations. For individuals with autism, learning to interact with first responders is critical. On the other hand, it is just as essential for first responders to understand autism and be prepared to respond effectively and safely to situations that arise involving individuals on the spectrum.

#### Class # 14 –Flashover Recognition- Saturday Only

FC-40000 (6-8hrs)

This course will provide information on flashover recognition and ways to survive. This course is designed to provide the fire service with a safe and secure method of flashover training. Firefighters are taught to recognize the signs of an impending flashover, provide techniques for possibly escaping an impending flashover, with the goal of saving firefighters from injury and death. The first three hours of the course will be the required lecture portion. The remaining portion of the course will involve hands – on Live Fire training using the Flashover Trailer.

#### Class #15 – ISO Update Class – Saturday

II-0000 (6-8hrs)

This course is intended for individuals to that would like to learn how to lower the PPC score for their community. The course will teach the calculations necessary to be able to predict PPC based on many factors. The course will cover preparation for a field visit, what documentation is needed, and ways to earn full points. History of ISO, ECC / Communications Center, Fire Department, Operational Considerations, Alternative Water Supply, Class 9 and 8B, Divergence, Community Risk Reduction, and New Changes In ISO

Instructor: Michael C. Morash – ISO

Instructor Biography: Mike began his career in 2003 in the South Florida area as a Field Representative. In 2011 Mike was promoted to SR. Field Representative where he assisted with mentoring of new employees across the country. In May of 2014 Mike was promoted to Manager of Community Hazard Mitigation for the South East Region. During his time as a manager Mike has been assigned the development of the PPC Mentoring team to align the mentors of applying the FSRS across the country. He is also part of the Technical Development Team and Alternative Water Team. Prior to working for ISO, Mike was a Police Officer with the New York City Transit Police Department, City of Palm Beach Gardens and the Indian River Shores Public Safety Department. Mike has worked on several large city/county surveys across the country and has participated in several conferences as a guest speaker on the old and new schedule and rules that will be implemented with ISO.

#### Class # 16 Pump Operations – Saturday

**Z-0000 (8hrs)** 

Basic pump operations for the rural setting, using calculations to determine water flow and friction losses and basic pump maintenance and upkeep. Hands On requires full PPE without SCBA.

#### Class # 17 – Safety Officer Class – Saturday

AA-0000 (8hrs)

Basic principles and application of safety officer duties and responsibilities during any incident.

Classroom, no hands on.



Instructor: Danny Blevins, SFRT 9

#### Class #18 - Live Fire with the Car Fire and Dumpster Fire Prop - Sunday

M0001 (4hrs), K0000 (2hrs), and O0000 (2hours)

Fire control techniques focusing on vehicle fires and garbage/rubbish containers.

**Equipment Needed:** Full turnout gear and SCBA with PASS device and spare cylinder. All turnout gear must be NFPA compliant with no component older than 10 years. Students will not be allowed to participate if the instructor(s) find that the gear is not NFPA compliant or otherwise poses a hazard. SCBA cylinders must have a current hydrostatic test date.

**Prerequisites:** Completion of NFPA 1403 required components prior to enrolling; "Live Fire Course Competency Validation" form. Any student with facial hair that impedes the seal of the face piece will not be allowed to participate in accordance with NFPA Standards.

#### Class #19 – Water Supply – Sunday

R-0000 (7-8hrs)

This class will look at options for water supply, finding and supplying big water when needed and getting water from hydrants and tankers/dump tanks. Hands On requires full PPE without SCBA.



The 2018 edition of NFPA Standard 1403 requires that: "Students participating in live fire training evolution who have received the required minimum training from other than the authority having jurisdiction shall not be permitted to participate in any live fire training evolution without presenting prior written evidence of having successfully completed the prescribed minimum training to the levels specified in 4.1, 5.1, 6.1, 7.1, and 8.1."

NFPA 1403 requires "student prerequisites" to permit participation in live fire training evolutions.
